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A Glossary to the Text of *The Awntyrs off Arthure*: M to Y, with an Index of Proper Names

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This is the second part of a glossary to the Text of *The Awntyrs off Arthure at the Terne Wathelyn* preserved in the London, Lambeth Palace Library, MS 491.<sup>(1)</sup> The glossary covers all the vocabulary and their variants beginning with M to those beginning with Y. This also contains an index of proper names, in which all the names and their variant forms are recorded.
